"The Law, however applied in a case, must be interpreted in a flexible manner so as to see that the rule of law is not frustrated. A statute is the will of the Legislature and an Indian statute is an act of the central legislature or of a state legislature. It includes Act passed by the imperial or provincial Legislatures in pre-independence days as well as Regulations. In interpreting or constructing a statute, the obvious method would be to start with the literal interpretation. But then, when the literal meaning of a word, it is far from its plain meaning we give to words. "The golden rule
